OVERVIEW

Founded in 1977, Christian Life School is a K2-12th grade evangelical, interdenominational, coeducational, college preparatory day school in Kenosha, Wisconsin. Located midway between Milwaukee, Wisconsin and Chicago, Illinois, the 215,000 sq. ft. of building and athletic fields are on a 45-acre campus in a rapidly growing business and professional community of 100,000 people. Students from the six-county area of Southeastern Wisconsin and Northeastern Illinois commute to the central campus for a 7-hour, 8-class period school day.

GPA COMPUTATION

The GPA is determined by adding the equivalent quality points, divided by the total number of semester credits. The GPA is taken from all scores earned in grades 9-12. Grades transferred from other schools are converted to the CLS grading scale. Starting 2019-2020, honors designations were removed from class titles and all classes were taught at an honors level. Honors courses prior to 2019-2020 are weighted. Honors-level transfer courses completed during or after 2019-2020 receive the honors designation in the course title but are not weighted.

LATIN HONORS SYSTEM

Christian Life School uses the Latin Honors system. We recognize students who are achieving excellence in multiple areas such as service, school involvement, and academic challenge.

SUMMA CUM LAUDE: Students with a weighted grade point average of 4.1 and above, 4 semesters of extra-curricular school activities, 4 credits of Advanced Placement (A/P)/Dual Enrollment (DE) classes, and 60 hours of service.

MAGNA CUM LAUDE: Students with a weighted grade point average of 3.9-4.09, 3 semesters of extra-curricular school activities, 3 credits of Advanced Placement (A/P)/Dual Enrollment (DE) classes, and 60 hours of service.

CUM LAUDE: Students with a weighted grade point average of 3.7-3.89, 2 semesters of extra-curricular school activities, 2 credits of Advanced Placement (A/P)/Dual Enrollment (DE) classes, and 60 hours of service.

Honors are based on accomplishments in 9-12th grades. Transfer students' records from previous schools will be included in their calculations.

Latin awards will be calculated at the end of the 7th semester (end of 1st semester senior year). Conditions for qualification must be completed by that time.

Extracurricular school activities include participation in athletics, membership in official clubs and organizations, and fine arts activities such as musicals and plays. All extracurricular groups are official and school sanctioned. Extracurriculars which are not part of CLS will not be accepted. Transfer students interested in qualifying for honors must provide official documentation of extracurricular participation at their previous school(s).

Service hours will be prorated at 15 hours per year based on years of attendance at CLS. Therefore, students who were not enrolled at Christian Life for all four years of high school can still earn a Laude recognition with less than 60 hours of service. Also, required service hours are not in addition to the 12 hours per year required for graduation or hours earned for National Honors Society. Instead, hours may coincide.

AP RESULTS 2021-2022:

58 Advanced Placement students took 91 AP tests with a 70% passing rate. Fifteen Advanced Placement students scored three or better on three exams and are considered AP Scholars. Four of these students scored three or better on four exams and are considered AP Scholars with Honor.

DUAL ENROLLMENT COURSES OFFERED:
On-campus full year course offered in partnership with Gateway Technical College: English Composition 1. On-campus one semester course offered in partnership with Gateway Technical College: Speech, Business.

TECHNOLOGY SERVICES

Technology services include email for all 5th-12th grade students, Google for Education, and Naviance. Blackbaud used for online student account management. Advanced, high-speed internet connectivity enables video communication services and text-based communication to remove locations. Internet and wireless accessibility is filtered and available to students and staff as well as four computer labs. Each student in the upper school is assigned their own Chromebook, making the CLS Upper School a 1-1 school.

LEARNING SUCCESS CENTER

The Learning Success Center (LSC) is the learning hub of Christian Life Upper School. Students are provided a quiet place to study, conduct research, check out a book or find help in a subject. Included in the LSC is the Tutoring Center that has two tutors on staff every hour to help students in any subject including Math/Science and English/History. The LSC has access to BadgerLink through the Wisconsin Department of Public Instruction as well as reference and periodical resources.
